This role offers hands-on experience in modular residential construction, on-site carpentry, crew coordination, and jobsite safety, while helping deliver four affordable homes in 2026.

Habitat Archuleta utilizes modular home construction, with homes set on permanent foundations and completed on-site with stick-built decks and garages. This position is ideal for students interested in construction management, skilled trades, engineering, or residential construction who want hands-on, leadership experience in a mission-driven environment.

What You'll Do

On-Site Construction & Coordination

- Assist the Construction Project Manager and Construction Supervisor with daily construction activities, including modular set completion, garage and deck framing, roofing, siding, and finish work.
- Coordination of volunteers during active build days
- Help track daily progress toward completing four homes during the 2026 build season

Volunteer Leadership & Safety

- Help lead, train, and support volunteers with varied skill levels
- Promote and enforce jobsite safety standards and best practices
- Assist with safety orientations, tool use guidance, and maintaining an organized worksite

Project & Material Support

- Organize and stage materials for decks, garages, and finish work
- Track material needs and monitor onsite inventory
- Maintain tool organization, site logistics, and jobsite cleanliness

Planning & Communication

- Participate in daily planning discussions with the Construction Project Manager and Construction Supervisor
- Communicate clearly with volunteers, staff, and community partners
- Support real-time problem-solving as construction challenges arise
