The Bureau of Overseas Buildings Operations (OBO) designs, acquires, constructs, maintains, and sells real properties internationally. OBO's Construction Engineers and Facility Managers help the U.S. achieve its foreign policy objectives by providing secure, high quality facilities around the world.

OBO seeks U.S. citizens between the ages of 21 and 59 who are available for worldwide service. Our Construction Engineers and Facility Managers receive paid housing and K-12 education for dependent children when serving overseas as well as paid training and other federal benefits.

## **Construction Engineers:**

- use their engineering skills and vertical construction experience to manage projects
- support sustainable design and energy conservation programs
- are accountable for quality assurance, financial controls, safety and security, commissioning, pre-construction and administrative tasks related to all aspects of building projects
- must have a Bachelor's of Science degree from an ABET accredited program in Civil/Structural, Electrical, Mechanical, or Architectural Engineering OR a Bachelor's or Master's of Architecture degree from an NAAB-accredited program.

## **Facility Managers:**

- are considered essential Mission personnel, serving as a member of the U.S. government's management team and providing a wide range of building-related services
- manage physical resources and direct asset management operations
- supervise engineers, tradesmen, maintenance staff, and other facilities personnel
- must have EITHER a Bachelor's degree in any major and three years specialized experience in the last ten years OR a Master's degree or higher in any major and two years Specialized Experience in the last ten years OR a Bachelor's degree or higher in Facility Management or Facilities Engineering with no required specialized experience.
